Budding Scientists Recognised at WA School Graduations

More than 1400 primary school students have been recognised for their passion and enthusiasm for science as part of the 2018 Woodside Scitech Science Awards.

Awards have been handed out at more than 740 school graduations and closing ceremonies across the State during November and December.

Ms Deb Hancock, Scitech Chief Executive Officer, said: "Congratulations to all the students who receive a 2018 Woodside Scitech Science Award. It is fantastic to see so many primary school students embracing science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) in the classroom. At Scitech we are committed to ensuring students across the State are equipped with the right skills and knowledge to productively enter the workforce of the future. Taking action now will make a huge difference to the social and economic well-being of Western Australia."

Jacky Connolly, Woodside Vice President People and Global Capability, said "Woodside is passionate about growing a diverse community of STEM innovators and collaborators. Students receive a Woodside Scitech Science Award for showing a curiosity about the world around them, a desire to experiment and investigate, an ability to use the scientific process to problem solve, and for their consistent passion and enthusiasm for science. These are all the qualities we want to see in the next generation of STEM professionals."

For each school that registers, awards are presented to two Year 6 graduating students at their end of year graduation ceremonies or book award evenings as part of whole school award presentations.

This year, award registrations were received in the following areas:

- 478 metropolitan and outer metropolitan schools
- 235 regional schools
- 35 remote schools

Successful students receive a science book, a Double Helix magazine, a discounted subscription to Double Helix Magazine, a 2-for-1 pass to Scitech and a certificate.

In 2007, through Woodside's Community Partnerships program, Scitech obtained a grant to run the Woodside Scitech Science Awards. The program has been running every year since this time, presenting a motivating end-of-year goal and providing an opportunity for Western Australian primary schools to encourage students to be actively engaged with science throughout the year.
