## Scitech Welcomes Chris Palandri as Board Chair

"We want to focus on our core activities: influencing children, young people, their families and teachers, and stimulating their STEM thinking," Mr Palandri said.

"Scitech already visits every school in WA every three years. I'm not sure that many people know that. The logistics of that are astounding."

"But we would like Scitech to be available to more people yet. One of our priorities will be to expand our reach and get out to more communities even more often, so we can have a greater influence on more people."

Mr Palandri is a past board member of the Property Council of Australia and a current Board member of the Australian Institute of Management WA.

His career has taken him through travels across Australia and New Zealand, but Mr Palandri says he understands how Scitech fits in the hearts and minds of West Australians.

"There's hardly a West Australian who doesn't know Scitech, young or old, it doesn't matter - it's a people's brand. We have a great foundation and I'm really excited about what our future holds."
